Ahoy there, Members! – Learn to Bowl Program

If any of you have family or friends who are looking for a new activity that ticks all the boxes, invite them to come and try lawn bowls at our wonderful Club to meet people and learn new skills. We are running a Come and Try Lawn Bowls Program as part of the Brisbane City Council's Active & Healthy Program with the aim of attracting new bowlers.

The Sunday program runs for six weeks and commences on Sunday 1 September. The first three sessions run on 1, 8 and 15 September with a break over the school holidays. This is followed by a further three weeks from 6, 13 and 20 October. At these sessions, we encourage those who are new to bowls to give it a go. The sessions run for approximately 1.5 hours, commencing at 12:30 and winding up around 2pm. All bowling equipment and tuition is provided free.

We encourage those who are interested in pursuing bowls to attend additional sessions in the weeks following their initial one. If they go on to join the Club, free one-on-one coaching is provided to initially get the new bowlers started and later to assist them progress through the bowling ranks as they become more familiar with the game.
