BowlsLink has provision for members to add an emergency contact to their profile. To action this, members can either log onto their account in BowlsLink and update their profile or, alternatively, send Pam Richardson or Vaughan Thomas your emergency contact's name and mobile number. On receipt, they will happily update BowlsLink accordingly.

The simple step of adding your emergency contact provides peace of mind, especially if you live alone or have medical conditions.
