DUCHESNE DAY - SUNDAY 2 MARCH from 2pm - 6pm



As most of you know, this is a big day in our functions calendar. Five hundred young people descend on the Club for an afternoon of fun on and off the greens. We need all "hands on deck" for this special day, particularly to help with supervising the bowls. It's good fun and we get to enjoy the vibe of the day. Mark the date on your calendar. NEWS FOM THE GREENS

Blue Green

The renovation of this green is complete and it is playing well. There is the usual issue with mites around the perimeter of this green which is being addressed. The mites produce the 'bare' areas which are becoming apparent on the clubhouse side of the green. Mites are difficult to control because the traditional insect controls don't work.

The Greenkeeper has sprayed with a special insecticide and this is having some effect. He has sourced another new insecticide (\$800 per 51) which he will trial with only about a litre being used at SLBC and the rest being used elsewhere. This green is in good condition but every effort must be tried to keep it free of mites otherwise it will deteriorate like last year.

Red Green

The renovation of this green is in progress with scarifying, coring, heavy rolling in high areas (along the eastern side) and top dressing either in progress or having been completed. The coring is necessary before rolling in the high areas for the rolling to be effective. The coring was done over the whole green to try to improve the drainage of this green in an attempt to control the moss and algae that impacted the green last year.

On Saturday during the heavy rain, it was apparent that the drainage of this green was still inferior to the blue green but hopefully it will be better than last year with the coring. Continued efforts are needed to improve the drainage of this green. Deep spiking and coring have been tried so far but if this doesn't work there may be a need to look at more drastic action. The problems seem to relate to insufficient subsurface drainage being used during the green construction. Less wet weather, more sunlight, less shading and more spraying for moss and algae would help keep the surface in good condition.

This green should now recover with warm weather and watering (or rain) helping the process. It is expected that it will take a few weeks to do so which means it should be available about the second week of February.
