- The Fashion Parade generated a surplus over \$2,000.
- Club revenue was up month-on-month due to more playing days leading to a higher number of bowlers.
- Tuesday social bowls will continue throughout the festive season with no closure as happened in previous years.

Game Stoppages

As we could be having a wet summer, let's discuss what happens if a game is <u>officially</u> stopped due to rain. "Official" means umpire or Games Director. Scores will be the same when the game restarts.

If the game is stopped before all the bowls have been delivered, that end is declared dead. If all bowls have been delivered, the score must be agreed before the game stops and players leave the green.
